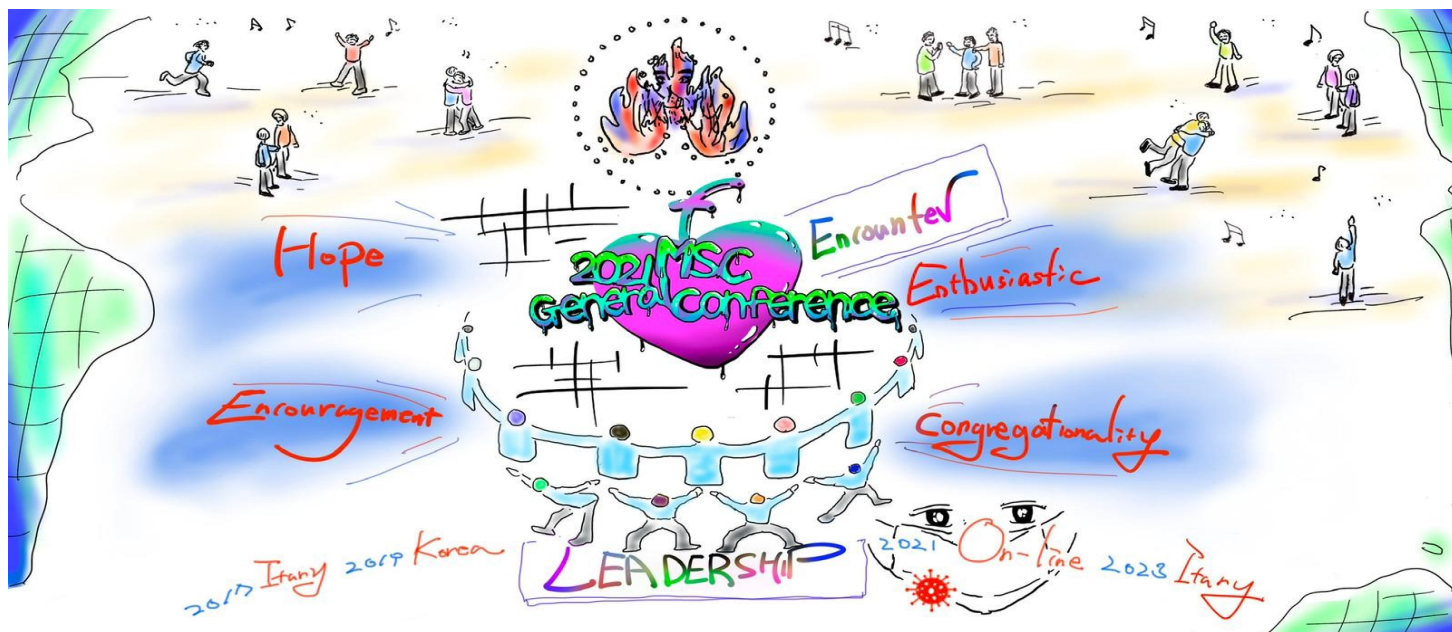

THE LAITY OF THE CHEVALIER FAMILY IN PREPARATION FOR THE 2024 INTERNATIONAL GATHERING

At the last International Gathering of the Laity of the Chevalier Family in Brazil 2017, it had been decided to hold the next International Gathering in 2023. The International Council together with the Tri-generalate agreed to hold that Gathering in the Philippines. A local Organizing Committee has been formed in the Philippines to prepare that Gathering. But we all know that since the beginning of the year 2020 we have been facing the Covid-19 pandemic and we don't know when it will end; we are not sure when the ban on flights from different countries will be lifted. In the pandemic situation it is also difficult for people to raise funds and other activities. Therefore, the International Council together with the representatives of the Tri-generalate and the Philippine Organizing Committee at a Zoom meeting in June 2021 has decided to postpone the next International Gathering to January 2024. As a consequence of this decision, the local committee was asked to contact the Don Bosco retreat center where the Gathering will be held to move the booking to January, 2024.

Although the timing of the gathering is still relatively far in the future, the preparations are being continued by the International Council together with the local committee in the Philippines. At the zoom meeting of 24th July 2021, the Tri-generalate, the Philippines Organizing Committee, and the International Council through a communal wisdom discernment reflected on the Theme for the Gathering, which is now being finalized in a concrete proposal by the International Council and the Philippines Organizing Committee and it is hoped that by October or November 2021 the proposal will be sent to all the National Councils for ratification. We also talked about other things to be prepared like the funding, programs, graphics, logo, song for the Gathering and especially the technical things regarding the work of translation to assist all the Gathering participants together in one room, for example, by using Zoom as a means of translation.

For the follow-up and the progress of all these preparations, another joint meeting of the International Council, Tri-generalate and Philippines Organizing Committee has been scheduled for early next year 2022. All are invited to support the Philippines Organizing Committee together with the International Council in preparing this 2024 Gathering.

JUSTICE, PEACE AND INTEGRITY OF THE CREATION

Pope Francis reminds us that the pandemic has “made visible the throwaway culture” (cf. *Let us dream*, p. 17) in which our people and planet have been suffering long before the virus. Greed and indifference have made global injustices ‘normal’, often supported by our everyday actions and choices. Right now, we are at a turning point where we can decide whether we are going to invest in a better future or to sink back into the old ‘normal’. All of this, in the context of the COP26 being held in Glasgow in November in the presence of the Pope and the Queen.

Pope Francis in his special prayer intention for the month of September invited us to pray that everyone might make choices that promote a simple and sustainable lifestyle. In his video message, Pope Francis reminds the faithful of the need for urgent action to combat the social and environmental crisis. In this month of September, as the Church begins the annual Season of Creation September 1, the pope addresses the environmental crisis humanity is traversing and holds up the example of young people who are environmentally conscious. "It makes me very happy to see that young people have the courage to undertake projects for environmental and social improvement, since the two go together," he said. The video was directed by Nicolas Brown (three-time Emmy winner) and co-produced for the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network by Vatican Media. Pope Francis said adults can learn much from young people, since they are often at the forefront of issues "related to care for the planet." "Let us take advantage of their example and reflect on our lifestyle, especially during these moments of health, social and environmental crisis", he said. "Let us

pray that we all will make courageous choices, the choices necessary for a simple and environmentally sustainable lifestyle, taking inspiration from our young people who are resolutely committed to this". We should take the opportunity to reflect on "the way we eat, consume, travel, or the way we use water, energy, plastics, and many other material goods, especially those which are harmful to the environment." Let us choose to change!" the pope said. "Let us advance with young people towards lifestyles that are simpler and more respectful of the environment." Today, the network connects millions of Catholics around the world from diverse countries, cultures, and social and ecclesial contexts, through prayer. Last June, the UN warned that the planet is "rapidly reaching a 'point of no return'" and that we're facing "the triple environmental threat of biodiversity loss, climate disruption and escalating pollution." This impacts the lives of all: "Our degradation of the natural world (...) is already undermining the well-being of 3.2 billion people – or 40 per cent of humanity". It also made reference to UN Secretary-General, António Guterres, who said that "for too long, humanity has cut down the Earth's forests, polluted its rivers and oceans, and ploughed its grasslands into oblivion. We are ravaging the very ecosystems that underpin our societies." The pope's insistence on integral ecology, said the statement, reminds us that "everything is interconnected in our lives" and that words are not enough to "protect our common home", as Francis already had written in *Laudato Si'*. "As in past years when Francis' intentions were about the oceans (2019) and the Earth's resources (2020), the September edition of the Papal Video is part of the global and ecumenical

celebration of the Season of Creation (Sept. 1 – Oct.4). In 2021 the theme is to renew the ‘oikos’, the home of God.

After the July flooding in Belgium, Germany and the Netherlands causing huge damage and numerous deaths, in early September Hurricane Ida made landfall as a category 4 hurricane, making it one of the [most powerful storms](#) to strike Louisiana in recorded history. Ida made landfall on the 16th anniversary of the devastating hurricane Katrina.

The region is [known internationally](#) as "[Cancer Alley](#)," due to the pollution from the large number of oil refineries, plastic manufacturing sites and other fossil fuel infrastructure clustered in the southern Louisiana region. The Gulf Coast is also prone to hurricanes, which climate scientists say have been made more powerful and unpredictable by the changing climate. Ida's track shows the storm's eye crossed the Mississippi to the west of New Orleans as it traveled north towards Baton Rouge. "This largely Black-populated stretch of the Mississippi River between New Orleans and Baton Rouge is lined with more than a hundred refineries and petrochemical plants," DeSmog has previously reported.

With wildfires blazing in the western United States and Canada and a hurricane that caused destruction not only along the Gulf Coast but as far north as New York City, the first days of this year's Season of Creation have made the global climate emergency virtually impossible to ignore. To the north, in Canada, an interactive wildfire information map shows scores of fires at various stages of control. Many of the hotspots are in British Columbia, but dozens also blaze across the central part of the country and as far east as Ontario. It may

look like mixed signals, but the combination of drastic drought and severe storms is a pattern that has been emerging over time and is consistent with predictions of a warming world. The severity of flooding, of course, depends not only on the intensity of the rainfall but also on human factors, such as where we choose to build our dwellings, how much land we pave, how much buffering wetland we destroy and how well we manage water. And ultimately, it depends on whether we can make the hard choices that will stop the global temperature rise. The weather is natural, they say, but the degree of disaster is often determined by choices made by humans. This disasters sound an alarm as we are celebrating the Season of Creation, which calls us to renew the *oikos*, or home, of God.

Therefore once more we kindly invite all the entities and communities of the CHEVALIER FAMILY

- to join urgently the 7 Years Laudato Si Platform launched on May 24, 2021. It is a journey towards an integral ecology helping all people of goodwill to implement the 7 Laudato Si goals and realize sustainable development. **CAUSE OF BEATIFICATION AND CANONIZATION OF THE
SERVANT OF GOD JULES JEAN CHEVALIER - DIOCESAN PRIEST
FOUNDER OF THE CONGREGATION OF THE MISSIONARIES
OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS (1824-1907)**

History of the cause:

- 19 July 2011: Nihil obstat of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints (Prot. N. 2840)
- From 25 May 2012 to 08 December 2013: Celebration of the Diocesan Enquiry in the Diocese of Bourges.
- 12 December 2013: Transmission of the Acts of the Diocesan Inquiry to the Vatican
- 16 December 2013: Opening of the Roman phase of the Cause of Beatification of the Servant of God Jules Jean Chevalier.
- 18 October 2014: Letter from Fr. Boguslaw Turek, Undersecretary of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, on the need to proceed with an additional investigation in view of the Validity of the Acts of the Diocesan Inquiry.
- 11 March 2016: Decree on the Validity of the Acts of the Diocesan Inquiry. This Decree of Validity is accompanied by a note signed by Archbishop Marcello Bartolucci, Secretary General, asking the Rapporteur of the Cause to contact the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith to consult certain "problematic" writings of the Servant of God.
- 28 October 2016: Announcement of the appointment of Fr Maurizio Tagliaferri, as Rapporteur for the drafting of the Positio on the life, reputation for holiness and virtues of the Servant of God Jules Jean Chevalier.



Where we are :

The Public Copy of the Acts of the Diocesan Inquiry carried out in 2012-2013 and the Supplementary Inquiry carried out in 2015-2016 on the life and virtues and the reputation for holiness of the Servant of God Jules Jean Chevalier was handed over on 5 October 2018 to Father André Bohas, msc, by the Rapporteur, Prof. Don Maurizio Tagliaferri of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. Father André Bohas, msc, is the collaborator of the Postulator General Father Jean-Jules Chassem, msc, of the Congregation of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

At the request of the Secretary of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, Archbishop Marcello Bartolucci, dated 11 March 2016, the Rapporteur, together with the Postulator General and his collaborator, went to consult the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith about the writings of the Servant of God. At the request of the General Reporter of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, in October 2019, Fr. André Bohas went to consult the Vatican Secret Archives (henceforth referred to as "apostolic"), the Vatican State Archives and those of the Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life.

In October 2019, the part of the Positio called Summarium Testium consisting of the formatting and study of the testimonies of the two diocesan investigations was completed. The editing of the reports of the Theologians and the Historical Commission presented at the two enquiries was also completed in October 2019. The work continues with the preparation of the abridged documented biography of the Servant of God. In October 2020, the Rapporteur Prof. Don Maurizio Tagliaferri asked Fr. André Bohas to begin the abridged documented

biography with a first chapter that should specify the political, historical and ecclesial context of the 19th century during which the Servant of God Jules Jean Chevalier lived, attaching at the end of the chapter the most important authorized documents that support the understanding of what will have been thus developed throughout each chapter. Historical research and numerous readings were necessary for the study of this political, historical and ecclesiastical context and its writing was the object of the work of this year 2021 (from November 2020 to August 2021).

What still needs to be done

It then remains to continue writing the documented biography of the Servant of God, from his birth to his death in a chronological presentation, presenting his activities and works. The most important documents collected during the diocesan investigation (in particular the 737 letters selected from a total of 2737 letters and other documents collected in the second volume of the Public Copy) will be inserted at the end of each chapter according to the content of each chapter of the biography. Some documents not used in the biography will then be presented in the Summarium Documentorum.

Some specific problems that have been raised about the life and writings of the Servant of God and that require study and response will be inserted in another part of the Positio called Selected Questions (especially those found in the file of Fr. Chevalier's file and consulted at the Holy Office on devotion to Our Lady of the Sacred Heart, on the statue of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart, as well as the relations with Fr Ramière and Fr Dehon, the questions raised in the Report of the theologians who studied the books published by Fr Chevalier).

Finally, the last part, called Informatio, will present in the Positio the path followed by the Servant of God to reach evangelical perfection and his permanent state of virtue, a presentation of the heroic exercise of the virtues (theological and cardinal, the auxiliary virtues as a religious and particular virtues) and his reputation for holiness.

When this work is completed, the Positio will then be studied by theologians (from Roman universities) chosen by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, and then, based on the results of

their research, a group of cardinals also chosen by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints will study the Positio. To all of them, theologians and cardinals, a copy of the book by E.J. Cuskelly, msc, "Jules Chevalier, the man and his mission - 1824-1907", will be given as a supplement to the abridged documented biography. After this long process, if all this work is positive, the results will be presented to the Holy Father by the Prefect of the Congregation of the Causes of Saints. The Pope will then be able to declare our founder, the Servant of God Jules Jean Chevalier, "Venerable".

Let us not forget that for our founder to be declared "Blessed", it is necessary to obtain through his intercession a presumed miraculous cure which will also be studied in another Positio on the miracle. The same applies to the process of Canonization.

It is therefore important that at this stage, with many steps still to go, all confreres and members of the Chevalier Family throughout the world (in their communities, in the parishes, movements, prayer groups, or schools where we minister...) pray and invite prayer intensely, persistently and tenaciously through the intercession of our founder, Servant Jules Jean Chevalier. Let us not forget to send in writing to the Postulator General, Fr. Jean-Jules Chassem, msc, our testimonies of graces received through the intercession of the Servant of God.

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25 years of the Mission in Ecuador

A Jubilee year always requires preparation, many meetings, planning, programming, organisation and expectations. Especially when it is celebrated in times of pandemic. But, as we dedicate it to our Mother Our Lady of the Sacred Heart, there is no need to fear, as she does everything in our Congregation.

The health emergency made us reflect and reorganise many things. On August 10, 2020, during the celebration of the 25th anniversary of the religious life of Father Francisco Wellikin, in the Canton of Chunchi, Province of Chimborazo, Ecuador, we declared this Jubilee Year open. We all remember Chevalier's phrase: "There is our place" (Chevalier 1875) and that of Father Jouet: "We all dreamed of a foundation in Quito". Now this dream is a reality!


From what was programmed for the Jubilee Year, we highlight two very significant events, the conversation by Zoom with all the MSC who are part of these 25 years. This was a moment in which we shared the experiences lived by each one of us, very significant experiences! A very motivating moment. Among many novenas and parish celebrations to make this Jubilee Year known, we also highlighted our ordinary MSC meeting of the Section in May. In

this second significant event we shared the devotion and affection we have for Our Lady of the Sacred


Heart. We studied the booklet, "Our Lady of the Sacred Heart", published by our confreres in Spain. At the end of our meeting we celebrated the Eucharist for the enthronement of the official image in the chapel of the Formation House. The image was specially made as a symbol for our jubilee year, carved in cedar

wood and with a photochromatic painting by the Escuela Quiteña de artes.

The first festive closing mass of the Jubilee Year was celebrated with a great popular devotion in the parish of Santo Domingo de Guzmán in the Cantón Chunchi, on Sunday, September 5, 2021. Monsignor José Bolívar, bishop administrator of the Diocese of Riobamba, presided over the celebration, concelebrated by the MSC of the Ecuadorian Section. Delegations from the communities and parishes served by the MSC shared in the celebration. Father Paco and the Chuncheños organised a beautiful celebration. Many tributes,

Dirceu, thanked all those present.

The second festive mass was held in the cathedral of Riobamba, on the 7th September, the 25th anniversary of MSC presence in Ecuador, where we gathered to give thanks to our Mother. A beautiful mass presided by Monsignor Victor Corral Mantilla, bishop emeritus of the diocese of Riobamba. We remembered the day that Monsignor Fernando Panico, msc blessed us and sent us from the Shrine of Vila Formosa, São Paulo, Brazil. With the Blessed Mother in his hands, he gave us the sending forth blessing. Here in Ecuador the first day we entered the cathedral (07/09/1996), She received us, together with Monsignor Victor. The image of our patron saint was prominently displayed in the presbytery. Together with many friends, benefactors,

priests of the diocese, religious men and women, we expressed our thanksgiving. Monsignor stressed the importance of our presence for the diocese and the Church of Riobamba. He spoke of our ability to work as a team, of our efforts at inculturation, of our participation in the Presbyteriate and above all of our choice to be in the most difficult and distant places for pastoral work. Excited and grateful, he blessed not only the MSC, but also the whole Chevalier Family that is already in Ecuador.

50 years of the MSC Indonesian Province

On October 6th, 2021, the MSC Indonesian Province will celebrate the 50th anniversary of the founding of the province. Before it became an autonomous province, MSC Indonesia was under the Dutch MSC Province. However, after going through various preparations, the MSC General Conference in Rome in October 6th, 1971 erected the MSC Indonesian Province and appointed Fr. P.S. Hardjasoemarta to be the first Provincial Superior.

The Acts of the MSC General Conference, held in Rome from 5 to 15 October 1971, states: “On

Chapter held in June 1971 judged that the time had come to ask for the erection of the Indonesian Province. The number of native-born Indonesians has been steadily increasing: 32 priests, 21 brothers, 20 students. Furthermore, there are still many foreign-born MSC working in Indonesia (136). These are free to decide whether they become members of the new Province or remain members of their Province of origin” (Analecta MSC, N. IV, Anno LXIX – 1971, p. 322). Since then, MSC Indonesia has been independent, managing its life and ministry



October 6th, 1971, the General Conference erected the MSC Province of Indonesia. Consequently, Fr Hardjasoemarta is the first provincial superior of the new province.” The preceding text says: “Indonesia has been a Vice-Province, or Provincial Administration since 1961. The special Provincial



independently, apart from the Dutch Province.

Many events have shaped the MSC Indonesian Province as it is today and towards the future. Therefore, celebrating the 50th foundation anniversary is a historical moment that deserves to be remembered and celebrated – remembering the



great works of God experienced in the history of God's People, especially the journey of the MSC

Congregation in Indonesia. This 50th foundation anniversary is not only an opportunity for Indonesian MSC to remember and celebrate, but also to renew their being and actions. Therefore, the theme is “Becoming Disciple of the Sacred Heart of Jesus who Remembers, Celebrates, and Renews His Being and Doing.”

In order to make this 50th foundation anniversary meaningful, the Provincial Superior with his Council launched the Jubilee Year in October 6th, 2020. The opening ceremony of the 50th Jubilee began with the celebration of the Eucharist, followed by a short ceremony to mark the start of the Jubilee Year. The launching ceremony took place in the Chapel of the Mother House in Jakarta and was broadcast virtually. In addition, following the launching ceremony, members of the province also marked the opening of the Jubilee Year in every District and Local Communities with different planned activities.

The Provincial Superior with his Council formed a committee in the province, headed by Fr. Florianus Miranta MSC (the vicar) to coordinate various activities to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the MSC Indonesian Province.

The committee worked to construct the history of the MSC Indonesian Province; to organize materials for reflection on the theme of the jubilee year; to construct a survey questionnaire and to present the results on the “being and doing”; to compose prayers; to prepare liturgies and to deepen understanding of the special prayers of the MSC; to prepare events to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the province ; to produce publications and

documentation; to hold social services and to raise funds to support activities of the 50th anniversary of the MSC Indonesia Province. Apart from the Province Committee, local committees were also formed in each District and Local Community.

The journey and growth of the MSC Indonesian Province cannot be separated from cooperation and partnership with the dioceses, institutions, diocesan priests, religious congregations, lay people and other partners. Therefore, this 50th Jubilee celebration is not merely a celebration of MSC but is expected to also involve our partners and all the faithful people. However, due to the Coronavirus pandemic situation, many activities were carried out internally, such as the preparation and publication of a book series on the history of the MSC Indonesian Province; prayers and novenas for the Jubilee Year; webinars on special prayers of MSC; recollection and reflections to deepen the theme of the Jubilee Year in the District and Local Communities; webinars on the theme “communio, missio, leadership and the future”. The committee has been preparing a memorial book and a ceremony for the 50th Anniversary of the Province. In addition to the activities coordinated by the Committee in the Province, each District and Local Community also carried out various activities to celebrate the Jubilee Year according to their context.

Thus, as a Province that is growing and developing, and remembering the historical milestones that have formed the province, together with the Blessed Virgin Mary, Our Lady of the Sacred Heart, all members of the MSC Indonesian Province exclaim: “My soul magnifies the Lord..... For the Mighty One has done great things for us” (Luke 1:49). Let us gratefully remember this historical moment: “May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be everywhere loved!” (Ametur ubique terrarum Cor Jesu Sacratissimum).

But it can also present a moment of splendid grace, a moment of self-emptying, that opens new horizons of love and reciprocal service. If we recognize our mistakes, we have nothing to fear, because it will be the Lord himself who will have led us to that point.

With malice toward none and charity toward all, I urge you to be humble instruments of the Lord, at the service of the victims of abuse, considering them as companions and protagonists of a common future, learning from each other and become more faithful and resilient so that, together, we might face the challenges of the future. May the Lord bless you, may the Madonna protect you, and please, do not forget to pray for me. Thank you.

HOPE FROM HOPELESS - LIFE FROM DEATH

No one in the world likes to live in any difficulty, or crisis, or disaster, or pandemic, etc. Normally, the people have to face up to these unexpected situations in daily life in order to survive or to find the meaning of life. I would like to borrow an image of the soil and the tree, that Đẹp Lão (nick name), MSC sent me this morning in order to express my feelings and my thoughts on the occasion of the renewal of vows that happened in our community in Vietnam this morning, August, 14.

God as soil is still there, at the root of the tree or somewhere else. The people as a tree have to cling on to the soil to grow up. It takes nutrient from the soil for its life. But sometimes, for some reason, there is less soil or no soil at all for some branches of the root of the tree. It causes many difficulties for the life of the tree. Sometimes, the soil is not enough for the tree, because of a landslide or because some roots of the tree have no capacity to hold the soil for themselves or people don't take care for the tree carefully. If this situation still persists, the tree will die.

At the moment, all the people over the world, particularly in Ho Chi Minh City are facing up to a terrible and horrible disaster, the Coronavirus-19 pandemic. Thousands of people are infected and hundreds of people die every day. The people now live in fear, panic and even suspecting each other. We lockdown ourselves from ward to ward, from house to house, and even from person to person.

However, the people are trying their best to keep their lives moving on. Every second of life, they try to regain the life from the Reaper.

In this situation, our brothers renew their vows. It's so hard for us to gather together as a community to have this celebration, because we can't move from house to house, even though we are so near each other. In Le Van Sy house, one senior professed brother, Vu Thanh Nguyen, MSC, accepts the profession of Tinh Dao Anh Nguyen, MSC, within the Liturgy of the Hours, Morning Prayer, because there is no priest living there.

In Banh Van Tran house, the profession is celebrated during the Eucharist, with the one of the formator accepting the profession of two brothers, Thanh Vu Nguyen, MSC; and Tien Minh Nguyen, MSC.

Sending a picture to us, Đẹp Lão, MSC said: *"I pray that you will hang in there, stay connected in whatever way you can."* Yep, we are living within the pandemic, and among fear, panic and suspicion, but we do not allow these negative spirits of the pandemic to disturb us much in any aspect of life. However, this is not a time to blame the pandemic, but a time to recover life from death, and hope from hopelessness. The Renewal of vows of our brothers is a living witness to that. They show their wholehearted trust to God. We, MSC members, are so joyful and happy to join with them in this atmosphere and spirit. Like the tree in the picture, we

are trying our best to cling on to God in order to regain life and hope for ourselves and for people.

On 26, 27 and 28 July 2021, the meeting of the members of the CA MSC was held on the digital platform Zoom. The meeting was coordinated by Fr. Dario Ircash, president of the entity and was attended by a significant number of confreres from the different provinces, as well as Humberto Henriques MSC, member of the General Leadership Team and on the last day, the Superior General, Fr. Absálon Alvarado, joined us. The main objective was to establish a space for sharing and to hold the election of the new board of directors.

The first day of work was marked by the sharing of the provincials. It was an opportunity to listen to the challenges and joys in this context of confronting the pandemic. It has been a demanding time that obliges all of us to rediscover the creativity of evangelisation. It was evident in the sharing how much we have grown with the challenges and have reinvented ourselves. Another point for reflection was the situation of the Andean region. This theme is already being worked on and is born out of the need to restructure the congregation: the possibility of an integrated mission among the four entities: Colombia, Ecuador, Peru and Venezuela. Moacir took up the thread of the process and so far we have suggestions for the future: to work on the sensitization of all on the need to rethink the way to optimize the mission in this region, to think of the possibility of a common formation that favours the creation of bonds, to plan for the exchange of missionaries between the entities and to form a joint missionary team for a specific work, for example, in the Amazon region.

The second day of work was dedicated to the evaluation of the common theologate in El Salvador.

FIRST FIVE YEARS IN MINISTRY

On August 23, 2021, at 7:00 PM, the Meeting of the First Five Years of the Province of Rio de Janeiro began in Juiz de Fora (MG), composed of the accompanier, Fr. Ruaro Cândido, and the following companions: Fathers Adeilson, Alisson, Bruno, Eliezer, Fábio Júnior and Magno Luís, and the deacons Pablo, Patrick and Roney.

The 24th began with Lauds at 8am. At 9h30, Ruaro was welcomed as the new accompanier together with the newcomers to the group, Fr. Fábio Júnior and the deacons. Ruaro presented his orientation programme, stressing the need for a culture of ongoing formation and personalised accompaniment. His plan of action consists of annual meetings with the group and individual colloquiums in the mission stations of each confrere as accompaniment. He concluded by sharing his journey, highlighting the challenges of that time when accompaniment was not part of the early years of the mission and the difference that this present programme makes. The whole group shared the necessity and importance of the accompaniment of a more experienced confrere. At 3:00 p.m. Father Attila, who has guided the group for nine years, told the story of how accompaniment came about. Then he shared his vocational testimony, telling the experience of his various missions within the Congregation. He highlighted the richness of the charism and the way of being of the Rio de Janeiro province, inherited from the Dutch missionaries.

The 25th began with Mass at 8am. At 9h30 Ruaro spoke on the theme of interpersonal communication, differentiating between



aggressiveness, passivity and assertiveness. He emphasised the importance of knowing one's own feelings in order to communicate in an assertive manner and to maintain healthy interpersonal relationships. Finally, he opened the floor for questions and made available material for training in assertiveness. Ronnie Anderson Diniz, the Provincial, spoke about the institutional structure and the changes in the experience within the institution that have occurred over time. He emphasised that MSC identity and belonging must be rooted in the experience of Mercy. At 9 p.m. the recreation took place, a moment of great joy and fraternisation.

The 26th began with Mass at 8:00. At 9.30 Fr. Ruaro thanked the group for their welcome and for the sharing that they had done throughout the meeting. There was unanimous agreement as to the relevance of the meeting in terms of coexistence and the topics discussed. The group suggested that the next meetings be held in other places so that all could take advantage of the opportunity to rest. Fr Ruaro said that he would soon be in contact with each one to arrange individual visits. The 2022 meeting will be held from 16 to 20 May in Bahia (BA).

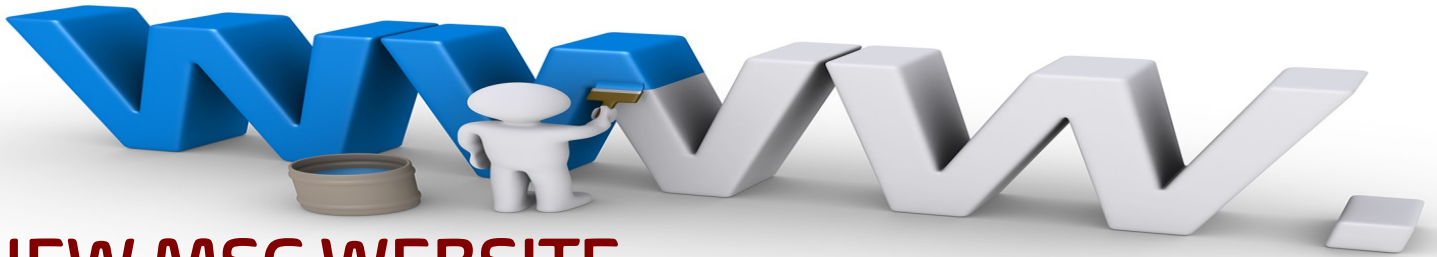

During this novena, in December 1854, we promised the Blessed Virgin that if she heard our prayer, we would take the title, Missionaries of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and that we would strive to carry out fully the beautiful and profound meaning of this title. (Jules-Chevalier, 1862)

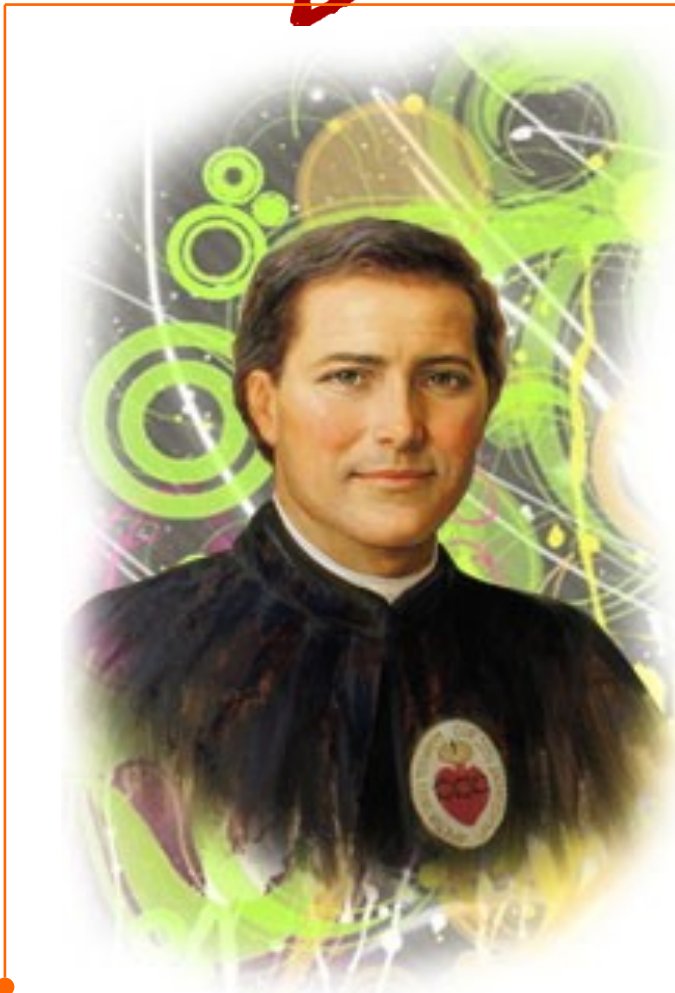
