# ACCOMPANIMENT "He has put his Spirit in our hearts" (2 Cor 1:22) Chapter of Rio de Janeiro Province

In the MSC Constitutions number 13 we read: "The spirit of our Congregation is a spirit of love and kindness, of humility and simplicity. [...] a spirit of love for justice and concern for all, especially the poorest". It was with the desire to renew this spirit that we celebrated the 3rd. Chapter of the Province of Rio de Janeiro from 2 to 6 January 2023 in Juiz de Fora/MG, Brazil.

The Chapter was opened with a message from the Provincial Superior, Father Ronnie Anderson Diniz, who presented the theme "Discernment for Mission" and invited us to be open and docile to the Spirit who animates prophecy and makes us coresponsible for the Congregation wherever we are. After the call of the 33 capitular members and the welcome to all present, the sessions proceeded in an atmosphere of prayer, openness and fraternity.

The Superior General, Fr. Mario Abzalón, was present, helping in the community discernment. He motivated those present to think about the realisations, opportunities, challenges and personal and community hopes, showing the importance of each individual placing himself with harmony and depth in the Chapter. Inspired by the biblical text of the "disciples of Emmaus" (cf. Lk 24:13-35), he exhorted the group to live synodality, building the journey together, opening themselves to new missionary possibilities, generating life for the Congregation and for all those to whom the Mission is addressed.

Among the themes discussed in the sessions, the reading, discussion, revision and voting on the Statutes of the Province and of the Triennial Community Project were highlighted. This was an opportune time to reflect on the pastoral practices, missions assumed by the group, community life and the economic organisation of the Province. Also on the agenda were the topics sent by the Generalate with the aim of including everyone in the preparation of the General Chapter. Finally, José Adriano and Pedro Henrique renewed their temporary vows and the group elected Fr. Daniel Martins as delegate for the General Chapter.

Huberto Van der Tog, our senior confrere, made the closing motion. A symbolic gesture that recalled the origin of our Province, built on the sending out of the Dutch MSC, their witness and love for the mission.

May Our Lady of the Sacred Heart help us to put into practice the inspirations of this Chapter, so that we may live, like Father Chevalier, open to what the Spirit of Jesus infuses into our hearts.

On Thursday 12th we started election our process. In the morning we were able to make а synthesis of all that we had experienced in

Abzalón Alvarado, our Superior General, was present and was the facilitator of the Assembly. The occasion gave our group the opportunity to evaluate its journey during the last six years in which Fr. Edvaldo Rosa de Mendonça led the Province as Provincial Superior.

On the first day, with the help of Fr. Absalon, we were invited to broaden our gaze and move from "ego" to "eco", that is, to consider our province in the context of the worldwide Congregation. Our province cannot be understood as a separate entity, but as a member of a larger body.

In fact, each area of the MSC mission in our province is led by a "Specific Council" (Communication, JPIC, Formation, Spirituality, Educational Ministry) and each councillor leads one or two of these commissions. the previous days and we prepared ourselves for the election itself, which took place in the afternoon.

Elected were Fr. Luís Carlos Araújo Moraes as provincial superior and Frs. Girley de Oliveira Reis (vice provincial), Benedito Angelo Cortez, Lucemir Alves Ribeiro and Sergio de Jesus Azevedo as councillors.

After many years of electing the leadership team in chapter, the Province of São Paulo has now made this new experience of election in assembly, in which all perpetual vowed members vote and the temporary vowed members elect a delegate to represent them.

In order to elect a delegate for the General Chapter of 2023, the Provincial Chapter was held on 13 March. Fr. José Eduardo Paixão was elected as delegate for this task.

We thank God and the confreres who have finished their service in the leadership team and wish all the best to the confreres who now assume this challenging leadership mission.

# ACCOMPANIMENT ASSEMBLY AND CHAPTER OF CURITIBA PROVINCE



Recently, from the 6th to the 10th of February, the Province of Curitiba, Brazil, held its Third Chapter Assembly in the retreat house Nossa Senhora do Amparo, in the Ukrainian Orthodox community Colônia Marcelino in São José dos Pinhais, Paraná. It was a time of meeting the confreres who were able to attend, 24 of whom were confreres with perpetual vows and temporary vows. In a very serene atmosphere, our assembly went according to plan. Humberto Henriques, member of the General Council, and Sr. Marian, of the Congregation of the Sisters of Divine Providence, who helped us with some reflections before we moved on to practical matters and the decisions to be taken.

Humberto shared with us about the General Chapter. He gave a brief introduction to the themes of the General Chapter and then went into more detail. The process we are living is a change of epoch, as Pope Francis has reminded us. He reminds us that this process of change also makes us fragile, but we must use it as means to trace the future of our congregation, remembering the founder who invites us to see the obstacles as means. "A new heart for a new world". In this way we can make the synodal process that Pope Francis asks so much of us, who says that it is not only a meeting, but that it is intrinsic to the Church, where the Holy Spirit is the Protagonist, it is the Church's way of being.

We also brought to mind the theme of the General Chapter, which says: "Were not our hearts burning while we journeyed together" (Lk 24:32), with the advice of Sister Marian,

Marian, was also a participant in our October assembly, and thus she was aware of the whole process that we were following and are living; she helped us with her reflections, bringing present the whole biblical text of the "Disciples of Emmaus", inviting us to be attentive to what Jesus does and says in setting out on the road with us, letting the Holy Spirit lead us and show us the decisions to be taken, always starting from the macro to the particular within the process of synodality. Sister Marian's counseling was very important because it helped us to trace out goals without the preoccupation of delivering or assuming works in predetermined times, but within a process that we are already living, with much serenity, patience, motivation and commitment to the whole congregation and consequently to the province, to take the necessary decisions, to give the appropriate directions and thus to continue our mission of making the Heart of Jesus more loved in the whole world, wherever we are.

Last year in July we had our first retreat given by Chris on the theme "Chrism and Heart Spirituality in the light of the Province Process" and this year in January we had our second retreat on the theme "Mission in the light of the Province Process" and the



As we have started walking and working together to become an MSC Indian Province, we are filled with lots of emotions of joy, gratitude, hope and anxiety. Here I would like to share with you all, in a few words, what has been eventful in the Indian Union in the last month of January 2023. Firstly, our retreat and then followed by the Extra-ordinary Chapter which chose two delegates for the General Chapter in September 2023.

In this light we have been asked to prepare for a historic event of growing to be a Province in the next year or so. Fr. Chris Chaplin msc who has been a leader and a companion to MSC India on behalf of the General Team of our Congregation, has been animating us in this process of discernment and third retreat later this year will be on the theme "Vision for the future in the light of becoming a Province". In these last two retreats we have had a deep sense of coming together and praying for one another. Chris highlighted in his short sessions of reflections about the life of our Founder Fr. Chevalier and about our Heart Spirituality, finally how special Our Lady of the Sacred Heart was for Fr. Chevalier. He spoke about Fr. Jules Chevalier's early life, his conversion after a fall from a cliff, had a great impact on his knowledge of God in the seminary where he was greatly influenced by Sulpician spirituality; how he was deeply convinced that the Heart of Christ is the healing place for the broken world. In the words of Fr. Chevalier, "Devotion to the Sacred Heart is a whole world of Theology... It embraces everything: dogma and morals, the past, the present and future. This is why this devotion is essentially social, setting things right" Fr. *Chevalier "Le Sacre-Coeur de Jésu" 1900: page:280.* 

The retreat had many graced moments in our prayer time, group sharing and the Eucharistic celebrations. It renewed our spiritual life as we had left all our pastoral works and set aside a week for this time of rest, reflection and renewal of body, mind and spirit. Fr. Chris taught us a wonderful method of discerning our life as MSC, what is called "Communal Wisdom", or discernment process. We learn to listen deeply to God's voice in each of the members of the community.

The two days of the Extra-ordinary Chapter was very meaningful and helped us reflect, reason, and revitalize our MSC charism and spirit. Darwin Thatheus msc, the Union Superior of MSC India enlightened us with a topic on MSC INDIAN HISTORY AND OUR MISSION IN INDIA AND OVERSEAS. It was indeed informative and encouraging to all members that there is a bright future waiting for MSC India, though as of now we may feel that we are like an adolescent community maturing to be leaders and ministers in the church in India and outside. The talk of Chris was an eyeopener for us: he made an emphasis on a call to make a journey inward, 'I' to 'WE". Our MSC members should have the experience of conversion from egocentric to 'Eco-centric' life. He outlined a process that many of us might have heard in recent times in our retreats; Encounter - Intimacy - Conversion -Mission. He also spoke about the need for true leaders in the Congregation and for the church that suffers the crises of abuse of power, sexual scandals

and clericalism. He told us that the idea of our General Superior Fr. Abzalon msc, on preparing leadership in the Church is a synodal approach. He has restructured the model of leadership in our congregation: the change from General superior and Counsellors to General Leadership Team. Yes, only a Team can win any challenge set before it. In that light, during the Chapter the capitulants proposed many ideas for the Union Mission. One of them is founding mission communities in Ireland and Singapore, and also sending more missionaries to other MSC missions. We spent a lot of time reflecting, praying and listening to each other for inspiration of the Holy Spirit to grow in communion and brotherhood as we dream of becoming a Province that can be a vital part of our Congregation's history.

# **14TH MSC PROVINCIAL CHAPTER OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA**



The 14<sup>th</sup> Provincial Chapter of MSC PNG Province convened at Couppe Conference Centre, Vunapope near Rabaul. The Chapter commenced on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> February and concluded on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February, 2023. There were 32 elected members who attended the Provincial Chapter, a representative of temporary vowed brothers, a scholasticate representative, and the rest were finally vowed members.

Fr. Roger Purcell MSC from the Australian MSC Province was the facilitator. It was a privilege to have Fr. Roger back, who willingly accepted the invitation and took time off from his busy schedule as director of MSC Mission Office to be with us. Fr. Roger was a missionary in PNG for more than 30 years and was well acquainted with some of the members. He made sure the Chapter process was orderly in its deliberations and discussions focused on important agendas that led to a statement made with recommendations approved by the Chapter assembly.

Unfortunately there was no representative from the MSC General Leadership team for the

Chapter. Fr. Andre Claessens was delegated to attend but that did not happen. Fr. John Willio, the Provincial Superior explained to the Chapter assembly that Fr. Andre's absence was attributed to late submission of key official documents needed to apply for PNG entry permit. It was also the first time for a representative of the General Council absent from PNG Provincial Chapter, something everyone realized we could do better not to repeat in the future.

The Chapter Theme was "A New Heart for a Synodal Church," particularly chosen by the Chapter preparatory team for each member and community to reflectively ponder on the reality of the province, at the same time, discern its life and mission focusing on Pope Francis' invitation for "a path of synodality" for the Church. In our case, the invitation is to discern as a province what God is saying to us, engage with the MSC congregation communally and being led by the Holy Spirit, to respond favourably to God' calling, and participate with the universal Church to carry out our mission according to what God expects from us. We realized the heart of the synodal experience is more than just listening to one another. It is listening to God through listening to one another.

Several reports were presented to the Chapter assembly for review and recommendation for the next administration to implement among others; from the outgoing Provincial and members of the leadership team, provincial bursar, from the team that looked after initial formation, the scholasticate in De Boismenu College, Bomana, and from the team that oversees ongoing formation and academic studies. What has been one of our ongoing problems in the area of formation has been a continuous lack of formators in our formation houses. COVID 19 was the reason given for the slow down in opportunies for further training of formators. As a consequence, formators felt burned out and over worked.

A brief report was also presented regarding proposed Serra Foundation funded projects, particularly updgrade of De Boismenu College, Bomana from its deteriorating state, and Chevalier Retreat Centre, Kinigunan in Rabaul, Kimbe House and the proposal of establishing a new school in Ugana, Kavieng. De Boismenu College houses our MSC Schoasticate. The Scholasticate was built in the 1960s with occasional maintenance in the following years. After 60 years, the college is in a very sorry state and is recommended for immediate review and maintenance. Serra inheritance is supposed to fund the project. Work, as we were told, is still in the drafting stage with ongoing negotiations about project costs with one of the possible developers to construct the building. At the moment, it is uncertain whether we will pursue negotiation with the current company or not.

Chevalier Retreat Centre was demolished in 2020 for a number of reasons, (1) the buildings were old and contained a lot of dust from the volcanic ashes and was condemned as posing grave health risk to retreat participants who use the facility, and (2) the administration assured the director Fr. George Tami that they endorsed the forwarding of a proposal for a new building to our MSC General Council and a request to the Serra Foundation executors to provide funding. Unfortunately, that did not eventuate and until now, the place has been left desolate. Still no work has been done on Kimbe House and Ugana school; the reason is the issue of land ownership. We hope the next administration will prioritize these projects with immediate effect as recommended by the Chapter.

Very little time was given to the pressing issue off safeguarding which is quite unfortunate. We hope the next administration will take this crucial area into serious consideration.

COVID 19 has forced us to operate within a framework of provincialism since the pandemic outbreak. The preparatory booklet for 2023 MSC General Chapter challenged us to shift from this model and espouse communal discernment with a renewed sense of congregationality. The province has been in isolation during the last few years, missing out on important meetings, dialogue and international MSC conferences. Group discussions tried to capture that spirit of listening to one another and opening up to each person's contribution, being aware that shared ideas and deliberations were not only means to arrive at a consensus, but to allow the Spirit of God lead us to discern wisely.

On Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2023, Fr. Sylvester Warwakai was elected as the new Provincial Superior of MSC PNG Province. Fr. John Willio will still be in office for the next two months. He finishes his term in April. We thank Fr. John Willio for his effort and contribution for the two terms her served as provincial superior. We wish him well and pray for his future ministry and appointment in the near future.

# MSC INDONESIA PROVINCIAL CHAPTER, 2023

MSC Indonesian Province held its 16<sup>th</sup> Chapter from 5 to 15 February 2023 in the Retreat House "*Panti Semadi*" Tomohon, North Celebes. There were fifty-four participants, priests, and brothers (2) and scholastics (2) coming from Districts, Formation Houses and even from abroad (France, Japan, and Cuba) who participated in this Chapter. The theme was "MSC Indonesia Province Responding to the Challenges of the New Age" and its sub-theme, "New Wine for New Age". The

communal discernment, reflected on the *lineamenta*, materials prepared by the Chapter Committee. The results of the personal and communal discernment became the main basic materials for discernment and discussion during the Chapter for the development of the quality of life and mission as MSC. The *Instrumentum Laboris* of the Chapter had as its main topics: 1. New Era. 2. Identity as MSC Religious. 3. Mission and Service. 4. Formation. 5. Safeguarding Protocol for Minors and Vulnerable



inspiration was taken from the Gospel of Matthew 9: 17, "People do not put new wine into old wineskins. Otherwise, the skins burst, the wine spills out, and the skins are ruined. Rather, they pour new wine into fresh wineskins, and both are preserved." The theme was chosen being aware that we are living in rapidly changing currents of this age, marked by technological development, especially information and digital technology.

Before these days there had already been a Pre-chapter where every community in every district and formation house, through a personal and Adults. 6. MSC Religious Governance. 7. Technology, Administration and Documentation. 8. Temporal Goods. 9. Participation and Partnership. Besides those topics there were also other specific topics that emerged from the process during the Chapter: 1. "*Kasih Mulia*" Foundation. 2. New Provincialate Building. 3. The use of handphone devices in Formation Community, 4. The issues about homosexuality in the Formation House, 5. Option for Merauke. 6. The possibility of creating a canonical community for the Kalimantan District.

The whole process led by Yong Ohoitimur

msc and Ignatius Welerubun msc went well according to what had been prepared by the Chapter Committee. It was really a moment of brotherhood encounter of listening, dialoguing, discerning, reflecting, discussing, evaluating and designing the life and the mission of the MSC Indonesian Province. The election of the Provincial and Vice Provincial was done after having reflected and discussed all the topics of the Chapter and after a moment of discernment. By doing so, the capitulants were helped to elect those who could really lead the Province for the coming years according to the vision of the Chapter. The Chapter elected Samuel Maranresy as Provincial and Sani Saliwardaya as Vice Provincial.

# JULES CHEVALIER A man with a charism by: JOAQUIM HERRERA, MSC

#### 1. A real fact

During the last few years, the meetings and encounters between the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart and between the different branches of the Chevalier family have multiplied. The Conferences of America (CAMSC), APIA, UAF-Africa and Europe, with their various lines of action and commitment, as well as the Cor Novum courses, the meetings of the three Generalates, the joint activities with the Laity, the work of the FAB in the field of economic solidarity, the Conference of Formators, various assemblies and especially the General Conferences... have been and are concrete achievements that have been setting common guidelines for action and an international sense in our being MSC.

Those who have been lucky enough to participate in one or more of these meetings will undoubtedly remember that one of the words most used in them is the word Charism. It is generally used referring to the founding charism received through Fr. Jules Chevalier, but it is also used in various other senses.

#### 2. A brief reflection

What does charism mean? Certainly, charism is not a thing. It is the action of the Holy Spirit who acts without ceasing in a free way and in multiple ways. Hence the great diversity of interpretations, divisions and subdivisions that are made of the charisms, most of them valid insofar as they manifest the multiform action of the Holy Spirit in carrying out the project of the Trinity on the cosmos, humanity, the Church and each human being.

Personally we must recognize that the primordial action of the Holy Spirit in us is the gift of faith: no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except with the Holy Spirit (I Cor 12,3). Faith is a free gift from



God; It is the action of the Holy Spirit that facilitates our personal experience with the God of revelation, manifested in Jesus Christ who is the visible image of the invisible God, before whom we must give a free, personal, conscious and total response that is manifested in the existential and integral option for him.

But who can encompass the breadth and the length, the height and the depth, and know the love of Christ that passes all knowledge? (Eph 3,18). For us to embrace here and now the fullness of the mystery of Jesus Christ is impossible. For this reason, in faith, the Holy Spirit, respecting our identity, temperament and characteristics, acts so that we have a peculiar vision of Jesus Christ manifested in the Gospel. Accepting the person of Jesus Christ with his double divine and human nature, the believer, moved by the Holy Spirit, focuses on one or various aspects of himself that he tries to convert into existential objectives in imitation of Christ: his love, his oblation, his poverty, his obedience, his detachment, his service,

#### 3. Some traits of faith in Jules Chevalier

The founding charism of Jules Chevalier is the fruit of his process in the gift of faith, of his own path in opening to the action of the Holy Spirit and in his personal response, within his concern for the dehumanizing and de-Christianizing realities of his time, which he called 'the evils of time'.

To grasp the great intuition of our Founder, we must employ a little trick. All of his important

projects, those he has completed and those that circumstances did not allow him to carry out, must be read from right to left, that is, in a way that is contrary to what we are used to doing. Thus we discover that the axis of his action, of his projects, of his life and of his faith is the Sacred Heart.

The heart, which biblically is the deepest part of being, the source of life from which thoughts, feelings, will and desire emanate, of Jesus Christ, God incarnate concerned for human beings, expresses his concept of God.

In 1862 Jules Chevalier wrote: "the Heart of the divine Master is the center in which everything converges, both in the Old and in the New Testament; the axis on which all Catholicism revolves, the sun of the Church, the soul of our souls, the source of our mysteries, the origin of our sacraments, the guarantee of our reconciliation, the salvation of the world, the remedy for all our ills. This is how I understand the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It encompasses everything, responds to everything."

A few years later, in 1887, he wrote: "devotion to the Sacred Heart is the essence of Christianity, and contains all other devotions. The Heart of Jesus is God, the love of God incarnate. God is love". "The Heart of Jesus means the whole Jesus. It is the center of all the human and divine actions that constituted the very life of Jesus".

Certainly the essence of God is love, since God is love (I Jn 4,8), and Jesus Christ is the maximum manifestation of God's love poured out on us and those who suffer (Cfr. I Jn 4,9-10). This is the basic point of God's image of him.

To this image of God, Chevalier arrived through a concrete path driven by the Holy Spirit. In every human being who embarks on the adventure of faith, we find three stages:

1. God takes the initiative and through the action of the Holy Spirit seeks the human person to make him a participant in his own life.

2. After a long pilgrimage in her own search for God, she is gradually illuminated by the Holy Spirit until she finds the image of God that gives reason and meaning to her own existence and her commitment to

history.

3. A deepening of the found image begins with the relationship, dedication, love, commitment and hope which intensify in a process of growing identification with the Lord.

We all know the path taken by Jules from the image of God received in his family, probably with some interference from the Jansenism that invaded his native France, to the image of God received from the Sulpician Fathers in the diocesan seminary and from the French school of spirituality of his time, until reaching the discovery of the God who loves his own in an individual, concrete and eternal way, in the presentation of the doctrine of the Sacred Heart.

Through her, the Holy Spirit acted in Jules and he gave the comprehensive response that turned his life into the life of a man in love with the Heart of Christ, of a Christ who loves us with a human heart. But the action of the Spirit continued to deepen the discovered image of God and began to focus on some specific characteristics of the love of the Lord Jesus concerned for the little ones, the poor, those who live without meaning. What are these peculiarities?

The previous question seems unnecessary and even naive. Any MSC knows very well what are the peculiarities of the love of Christ that the Spirit made Jules see and that responded to his personal trajectory and the founding charism for which he was preparing

him. In fact, they are constantly remembered, in all the meetings we talked about at the beginning and in the cradle to the cross, the strength and sweetness of various circumstances of our lives, when affirming Jesus appear in a very special way... As Missionaries that we must be a manifestation of the compassionate, of the Sacred Heart we must bear the seal that marked tender and merciful love of God revealed in Christ.
